



# Sliding Fee Scale

## Introduction

A sliding fee scale is a variable pricing model designed to adjust costs based on an individual's ability to pay. This scale ensures that professional services remain accessible to those with varying financial circumstances. Below is the sliding fee scale for specific professional services.

## Professional Fees

- Intake: \$240
- 38-45 minutes: \$150
- 46-60 minutes: \$175
- Family Session: \$200
- Group Session: \$100
- Med Management Intake: \$250
- Med Management Follow-up: \$150

## Sliding Fee Scale Structure

The sliding fee scale is typically divided into several tiers based on household income and size. Clients provide documentation of their financial situation, and fees are adjusted accordingly. Below is an example of how the sliding fee scale might be structured using the 2024 Federal Poverty Level (FPL) figures for families up to 5 members:

Income Level (2024 FPL)	1 person	2 persons	3 persons	4 persons	5 persons	Fee Adjustment

Below 100% of FPL	\$14,580	\$19,720	\$24,860	\$30,000	\$35,140	90% discount
100% - 150% of FPL	\$14,580 - \$21,870	\$19,720 - \$29,580	\$24,860 - \$37,290	\$30,000 - \$45,000	\$35,140 - \$52,710	75% discount
150% - 200% of FPL	\$21,870 - \$29,160	\$29,580 - \$39,440	\$37,290 - \$49,720	\$45,000 - \$60,000	\$52,710 - \$70,280	50% discount
200% - 250% of FPL	\$29,160 - \$36,450	\$39,440 - \$49,300	\$49,720 - \$62,150	\$60,000 - \$75,000	\$70,280 - \$87,850	25% discount
Above 250% of FPL	Above \$36,450	Above \$49,300	Above \$62,150	Above \$75,000	Above \$87,850	No discount

## Example Calculation

To illustrate how the sliding fee scale applies, consider a professional service with a base fee of \$240 (90791):

- If a single person's income is below \$14,580, they would receive a 90% discount, reducing the fee to \$24.
- If a couple's income is between \$19,720 and \$29,580, they would receive a 75% discount, reducing the fee to \$60.
- If a family's income of three is between \$37,290 and \$49,720, they would receive a 50% discount, reducing the fee to \$120.
- If a family's income of four is between \$60,000 and \$75,000, they would receive a 25% discount, reducing the fee to \$180.
- If a family's income of five is above \$87,850, they would pay the full fee of \$240.
